



2021 National Championships

The following guidelines have been agreed in consultation between AA and all the RGB's.

Archery Australia's Online National Tournament

- Shot on four separate days in-between 15/9/21 – 19/12/21
- Each RGB will pick days that best fits their calendar and may choose to shoot the event concurrently with the 2021 National Youth Championships or as part of a State Tournament.
- The days do not need to be concurrent but must include 2 x 720 rounds and 2 x 1440 rounds. WA and AA Rounds relevant to their age division.
- An archer's best (single) scores over the two rounds used as the archer's competition score.
- The two shoot dates will allow for any anomalies in weather and ensure those who want to participate can have the opportunity to post at least one score if a selected date is inconvenient.
- The tournament will include Short distance target (720) and 1440 rounds with no field or clout.
- Medals for Short Distance and 1440 Rounds to be awarded separately.
- Regional basis with
 - ACT – 1 location
 - NQLD – 2 locations
 - NSW – 1 location
 - SA – 1 location
 - SQAS – 2 locations
 - TAS – 1 location
 - VIC – 1 location
 - WA – 1 location
- Archers could shoot in a location that's most suitable to them e.g. Armidale participant shoots at SQAS location, SA archer in VIC
- Archery fields are to be large enough to allow single flight on each day – no AM/PM shoots
- This tournament eliminates issues with possible border closures, but at the same time some LGA restrictions may affect attendance.
- Archery Australia will not charge any fees for participation.
- Archers can only shoot two of each round as a maximum.
- All locations run with full complement of judges under tournament conditions.
- National Tournament records will not be awarded, however, Australian and State Records can be achieved as the events will be shot under tournament conditions.
- There will be no RGB Teams competition.
- There will be no Best All Round award
- Para and VI rounds will be available
- The 1440 Para and VI Rounds will consist of a double 720.



- Para archers must decide if they wish to compete in the Para Tournament or the able body Tournament for each event – that is, they need to decide at time of registering which division they will shoot in for both the 1440 and 720 rounds
- Where an RGB hosts the Senior and Junior Tournaments concurrently, youth archers must register in only one tournament. If however the RGB is hosting their Youth and Senior Tournaments on different dates, a youth archer can register and compete in both tournaments.
- Rounds to be shot must be as per the AA Shooting Rules as listed below in Appendix A

Note – whilst it is preferred that the event is completed by the 19/12/21, we will need to be flexible depending upon possible Covid restrictions within an RGB.
