
WORLD ARCHERY ARROWHEADS



Listed below are the scores required for the various World Archery Arrowheads shot over the minimum 24 Target Marked or Unmarked rounds (scored out of 432) in registered World Archery Arrowhead field events.

18 RECURVE (Sighted) (Red Pegs/*U18 Blue)

* ARROWHEADS FOR U18 ARCHERS:

Using these tables, U18 archers shooting their specific round in the Green Arrowhead score range may claim a Green Arrowhead. A score of Grey Arrowhead level or higher means that the archer is eligible to claim a Grey Arrowhead. This also applies to our U16 sighted archers shooting from Blue pegs and U16 and U14 barebow recurvers shooting from Yellow pegs. No Arrowheads higher than Grey may be claimed unless the athlete is shooting the Open rounds.

COMPOUND (Red Pegs/*U18 Blue)

There are 2 ways of acquiring World Archery Arrowheads:

- A World Archery Arrowhead may be claimed if the archer has shot the required score in a World Archery (WA)
 Registered event. Low level awards maybe purchased via the recorders Archery Shop and will incur a cost. High
 level awards (gold) have to be claimed via National Recorder. The claiming process varies depending on the
 RGB so check with your state recorder.
- 2. Archers may at any time choose to purchase lower level Arrowheads if they hold an Arrowhead higher than the ones they want to purchase. These maybe purchased by club recorder via Archery Australia recorder shop.

Only one Arrowhead of each colour may be awarded to an archer even if shot with two bow types or over several age divisions as there is no difference in the awards unlike the situation with the differing recurve and compound World Archery Stars.

Claims for Gold Arrowheads must be made by the RGB recorder on the completed claim form and accompanied by the appropriate completed scoresheets. These awards are individually processed by WA from claims made to WA by the AA Recorder. The claim form can be obtained by the RGB recorder from the AA Recorder.

WORLD ARCHERY STARS



World Archery Stars are available for archers using recurve or compound bows in registered World Archery Star events and they must be:

Men shooting a 90m Round (90m, 70m, 50m, 30m) Women shooting a 70m Round (70m, 60m, 50m, 30m)

World Archery Stars are for scores of 1000 (white), 1100 (black), 1200 (blue), 1300 (red), 1350 (gold) and 1400 (purple). The Gold World Archery Star on a coloured circular background is the Compound Star, whereas for recurve the 1000 one is just the gold star, and the higher ones are on a shield of the relevant colour.

There are 2 ways of acquiring World Archery Stars:

- 1. A World Archery Star may be claimed if the archer has shot the required score in a World Archery (WA) Registered event. The claiming process varies depending on the RGB and the event so please check with the RGB Recorder. Stars are ordered via your RGB Recorder and may incur a cost.
- 2. Archers may at any time choose to purchase lower level Stars if they hold a Star higher than the ones they want to purchase. Requests are to be made through your RGB Recorder and there are no time limits.

An archer may claim only one of each World Archery Star, but as the recurve and compound stars are considered different awards archers may claim both the recurve and compound World Archery Stars if they shoot both bow types.

Claims for 1350 and 1400 World Archery Stars must be made by the RGB recorder on the completed claim form and accompanied by the appropriate completed scoresheets. These awards are individually processed by WA from claims made to WA by the AA Recorder. The claim form can be obtained by the RGB recorder from the AA Recorder.

SILVER STAR AWARD



Silver Star Awards follow the same rules but are only for recurve and compound archers competing in the Cadet or Master categories with:

U18 Boys and 50+ Men shooting 70m Round (70m, 60m, 50m, 30m) U18 Girls, 50+ Women shooting a 60m Round (60m, 50m, 40m, 30m)

The Silver Star Awards are identical to the World Archery Stars except that any gold colouring on the World Archery Stars is replaced by silver. Archers already holding an award of a higher level as described above may purchase lower level Stars.

Claims for 1350 and 1400 Silver Star Awards must be made by the RGB recorder on the completed claim form and accompanied by the appropriate completed scoresheets. These awards are individually processed by WA from claims made to WA by the AA Recorder. The claim form can be obtained by the RGB recorder from the AA Recorder.

World Archery Target Awards are available for archers using recurve or compound bows in registered World Archery (WA) events, and shooting the following scores for the appropriate round:

There are 2 ways of acquiring World Archery Target Award:

- A World Archery Target Award may be claimed if the archer has shot the required score in a WA Registered event. Low level Target Awards maybe purchased by club recorders from Archery Australia Recorder Shop. High level awards (Gold and Purple) need to be claimed by National Recorder and the claiming process may vary so check with your RGB recorder.
- 2. Archers may at any time choose to purchase lower level Target Awards if they hold a Target Award higher than the ones they want to purchase.

Claims for Gold and Purple Target Awards must be made by the RGB recorder on the completed claim form and accompanied by the appropriate completed scoresheets. These awards are individually processed by WA from claims made to WA by the AA Recorder. The claim form can be obtained by the RGB recorder from the AA Recorder.


Silver Target Awards are available only for archers competing in the U18 or 50+ categories using recurve bows in registered World Archery events, and shooting the following scores for the appropriate round:

Event	White	Black	Blue	Red	Gold	Purple
60m Round	500	550	600	650	675	700

The Silver Target Awards are the same as the Target Awards except that any gold background colour on the Target Awards is replaced by silver. Only one Award of any colour will be issued regardless of the round for which it is obtained. Cadet and Master archers may claim the usual Target Awards for the other available rounds.

Claims for the Silver Target Gold and Purple Target Awards must be made by the RGB recorder on the completed claim form and accompanied by the appropriate completed scoresheets. These awards are individually processed by WA from claims made to WA by the AA Recorder. The claim form can be obtained by the RGB recorder from the AA Recorder.

AA AUSTRALIAN STARS



Australian Stars are available for all archers shooting in a registered World Archery Star event, but over a round or using equipment that makes them ineligible to claim World Archery Stars or Silver Stars. Those archers shooting rounds for which either World Archery Star is claimable may claim an 800 or 900 Australian Star if their score is between 800 and 999

Please note that the 'designated round' mentioned below is the one listed in Chapter 3 of the AA Rule Book for that age group and bow type to shoot at the AA National Championships. The following may therefore claim Australian Stars:

1. Compound and Recurve

Open, U21, U18 and 50+ archers shooting their designated round and scoring between 800 and 999 60+/70+ Women shooting a 50/1440 Round 60+/70+ Men shooting a 60/1440 Round U16 archers shooting an 50/1440 Round U14 archers shooting a 40/1440 Round

- 2. All Barebow Recurve archers shooting their designated rounds
- 3. All Barebow Compound archers shooting their designated rounds
 - 4. All Longbow archers shooting their designated rounds
 - 5. All Crossbow arbalists shooting an Australian 960 round

LEVEL OF CLAIMABLE AUSTRALIAN STARS

Compound and Recurve may claim from 800 upwards in increments of 100 but including 1350

Barebow may claim from 800 upwards in increments of 100

Longbow may claim from 600 upwards in increments of 100

Crossbow Stars are green and are available for 750, 800, 830, 860, 890, 920

There are 2 ways of acquiring Australian Stars:

- 1. An Australian Star may be claimed if the archer has shot the required score in a WA Registered event. Low Level stars maybe purchased by club recorder via Archery Australia recorder shop
- 2. Archers may at any time choose to purchase lower level Stars if they hold a Star higher than the ones they want to purchase.

Archers achieving World Archery Stars may purchase lower level Australian Stars relevant to their bow type.

Claims for 1350 and1400 Australian Stars must be made by the RGB recorder on the completed claim form and accompanied by the appropriate completed scoresheets. These awards are individually processed and recorded in AA database. The claim form can be obtained by the RGB recorder from the AA Recorder.

Australian 720 Star

These are available to all members who shot a 720 round in either a registered tournament or QRE.

Each year there will be a new 720 Star available so you can strive to maintain your level each year or achieve a higher award.

Archery Australia 720 Stars are available for Recurve shooting the 70m 720 round (122cm target face) and Compound 50m 720 round (80cm 5 ring target face).

How to Claim an Australian 720 Star?

These maybe purchased by the club recorder via the Archery Australia Recorder Shop

Australian Field Stars

Australian Field Stars are available to all archers competing in a registered World Archery 24 target Field Tournament or QRE. The award is an annual award intended for all age categories, Gold – Recurve, Red – Compound, Blue Barebow (Recurve and Compound) and Green – Longbow.

AA CLASSIFICATION MEDALS



Archers and arbalists are able to achieve the following classifications

WhiteBlackBlueRed

➤ Gold ➤ Master Bowman (MB)

Grand Master Bowman (GMB)
 Elite Bronze
 Elite Gold

for each of Target, Indoor, Field, Clout and Flight. For the requirements of these awards please refer to Archery Australia Shooting Rules Chapter 4. Whilst it can be a complex procedure a few points to note are:

Frequency: White through to Gold awards are one-off achievements, but Master Bowman, Grand Master Bowman and Elite Awards are able to be claimed annually. The first five medals simply indicate the level achieved (by colour) whilst for Master, Grand Master & Elite levels the year is indicated on the medal insert.

January 2024

Claiming: The colour awards are held by Club Recorders and are issued to the archers who have met the criteria stipulated by Archery Australia. The Club Recorder must make MB/GMB/Elite claims, forward them to their RGB Recorders who verify and sign that the claims meet the requirements. The Elite claims will then be sent to the Archery Australia Recorder who will check the claims, issue the awards, and note them on the Archery Australia database.

Event round: For all MB/GMB awards, at least one of the three rounds submitted must have been shot at a tournament. For all Elite awards, the three rounds submitted must have been shot in tournaments

The Classification Medals are diamond in shape:

Target - bronze with coloured insert or panel

Target Master Bowman/Grand Master Bowman - bronze with detailed white insert

Indoor - black and gold with coloured insert or panel

Indoor Master Bowman/Grand Master Bowman - black and gold with detailed white insert

Field - silver + black and white target with coloured insert or panel

Field Master Bowman/Grand Master Bowman – silver + black and white target with detailed white insert

Clout – silver + yellow clout with coloured insert or panel.

Clout Master Bowman/Grand Master Bowman - silver + yellow clout with detailed white insert

Elite Awards - Gold, Silver or Bronze

OTHER AA MEDALS

All Gold and Perfect Ten medals



Medals for achieving either six arrows in the gold (9s and 10s) or all six arrows in the 10 on one end are available for regular shooting distances. The medals are available in 3 colours for the following events with an insert showing the distance over which the arrows were shot. The archer usually indicates on their scorecard if they wish to claim one or more of these medals.

Bronze Medals for club events

Club Recorders shall administer these awards and are awarded at that club recorder's discretion on evidence of a correctly completed scorecard.

Silver Medals for State Championship events

RGB Recorders will administer these awards. The medals are only available when the scores are shot at an event at which a state title is decided. The RGB Recorder will require the evidence of a correctly completed scorecard before awarding the medal claimed.

Gold Medals for National Championship and major events

AA Recorder or RGB recorder will administer these awards. These medals are only available to archers meeting the requirements while competing at an Australian National Championship, World Championship or World Ranking Event.

Inserts are available for the following distances in metres:

122cm target face: 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 45, 50, 55, 60, 70, 90,

80cm target face: 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 50, 60 (indicated by an 'M' under the number)

Indoor targets: 18, 25 (number on a grey background instead of white)

Clout: 100, 125, 145, 165, 180

Important Notes

Perfect and All Gold awards may be claimed more than once for each medal type, colour, face size and distance regardless of Division/Class

For Bronze Perfect or All Gold awards there MUST be at least three current registered affiliates (members) participating in the scoring and witnessing process

Please note that when 3 arrow ends are shot the 'end' required for one of these awards needs to be equivalent to the 6 arrows shot in 6 arrow ends. This means arrows 1 - 6, 7 - 12, 13 - 18 etc of a range, not arrows 4 - 9 or 16 - 21 etc.

Athletes who have to shoot rounds that have four (4) and two (2) bolt ends shall be awarded the same Perfect award as the athletes (for six arrows) and shall comply with all other conditions for the awarding of that medal. Two bolt ends are to be in two consecutive ends that are multiples of four (4) bolts, e.g. bolt numbers 1 - 4, 5 - 9, 9 - 12, etc of a distance or round

Field Pins



Stocks of these pins may be held by RGB Recorders and individual clubs, and awarded by the Club Recorder once evidence of the required score is provided. The pins are the same whether claimed for a club shoot or a tournament.

Field All Gold Pins: For a World Archery Field Round when the 3 arrows on the one target are all in the gold scoring 5s or 6s. These are claimable for each distance from 5m to 60m

Field Perfect Pin: For a World Archery Field Round when the 3 arrows on the one target are all in the 6 ring, scoring 18. These are claimable for each distance from 5m to 60m

Field 20 Pins: For other rounds where 4 arrows are shot per target and the maximum possible score of 20 on one target is achieved.

You can also purchase an insert to put in the middle of the Field Pin to indicate the distance the All Gold or Perfect was achieved. You will need to indicate this on the scoresheet.
