

Essential preparation for competition

This tournament will be shot under World Archery and Archery Australia rules and policies.

The <u>Archery Australia Education Plan</u> identifies completion of the following Sport Integrity Australia anti-doping courses as mandatory for competitors in the Archery Australia National Championships:

- Anti-Doping Fundamentals
- Annual Update for 2025

To complete these courses, archers should register/login at <u>elearning.sportintegrity.gov.au</u>. The courses can be accessed through the course catalogue.

In addition, the following Sport Integrity Australia integrity courses are recommended for competitors:

- · Competition manipulation and sports gambling
- Safeguarding children and young people in sport induction

Appeals

A \$150.00 (Australian currency) fee for disputes, protests or appeals shall apply and is refundable if the appeal is successful. The fee for an unsuccessful appeal will be paid to Archery Australia.







Dress Regulations

To present the best possible image for our sport, to our sponsors and to the general public, Archery Australia Rule 7.11, Dress Regulations, will be enforced.

- Athletes shall be neatly and cleanly dressed. Such attire may be White, Club, RGB or sponsor related merchandise.
- NO Archery Australia, Olympic or Paralympics uniforms can be worn. Archers will not be allowed to shoot if any of the above is worn (this includes shorts and track pants).
- During inclement weather conditions all persons on the field of play may wear suitable protective clothing at their discretion.
- Shoes or boots shall be worn at all times by athletes and these shall cover the entire foot; sandals or thongs are not permitted.

The following items of clothing are not permitted:

- Clothing with inappropriate or offensive images, slogans or advertising
- Untidy, unclean, damaged or torn clothing
- Boardshorts
- Clothing with "camouflage colours", which may be trademarked
 or other digital designs, whether random or not and regardless of
 colours used, consist of natural material camouflage patterns
 such as bark, twigs, or leaves that are used for the purpose of
 blending in with natural environments thereby providing less
 visibility. Camouflage patterns in non-traditional colours such as
 pinks, blues, bright yellow, etc. that are used in designs for the
 purpose of blending in with natural environments providing less
 visibility are also considered camouflage.







Target Rounds and Matchplay

The Program

The program is indicative only of how each day will be run and the only FIXED time is the start time each morning, or afternoon for target rounds.

The medal matches on Saturday the 22nd will run continuously throughout the day with the only fixed time being the start time for the day. Please ensure you are present at the range well in advance of your match.

Arrow Timing

After the 10 second walk up buzzer the timing clocks will be set as follows:

6 arrow ends (1440/900) will have the clocks set at 240 sec – 40 secs per arrow

6 arrow ends (720 Rank) will have the clocks set at 180 secs – 30 secs per arrow

6 arrow ends (Teams) will have the clocks set at 120 secs – 20 secs per arrow

 $4\ arrow\ ends\ (Mixed\ Teams)\ will\ have the clocks set at <math display="inline">80\ secs$ - $20\ secs\ per\ arrow$

3 arrow ends (Individual Matchplay) will have the clocks set at 90 secs – 30 secs per arrow

1440 Round

All archers will shoot 6 arrow ends for all distances of the 1440 round.

All male & female Open recurve archers will shoot on the 80cm 10-5 scoring zone target faces for their two shortest distances.

All compound archers will shoot on the 80cm 10-5 scoring zone target faces for their two shortest distances







Practice

The range will only be open to practice as per the times specified in the program

On finals day (Saturday) there will be a practice field available to archers who are participating in Gold and Bronze matches only

Breaks

During target rounds (1440/900/720) there will be a 10 minute break between each distance for field reset and breaks for the archers. There will not be an extended break between the 2nd and 3rd distance for the 1440 round.

Cut for Teams

There will be a cut off for the top 16 matchplay teams for all bow types and genders.

There will be a cut for the top 32 matchplay mixed teams for all bow types.

Registrations for Teams and Mixed Teams has closed. Do not ask if you can form a team if it was not registered by the required date.

Scoring

Electronic scoring will be conducted using Archers Diary for the 1440 and 900 rounds and IANSEO Scorekeeper NG for the WA720 ranking round and all Matchplay. All archers are responsible for ensuring your scores are entered into Archers Diary or IANSEO as the round progresses and for confirming accuracy of paper and electronic scoring prior to submission of scoresheets.

Please ensure your scoring device is fully charged before arriving at the range.







BARA Award

The Best All Round Archer award will be awarded to the archer who achieves the highest accumulative score for the National Field, Indoor and Target (1440 and 900) Championships.

To be eligible for this award archers MUST have shot the Open distances for each of the above tournaments.

NB an archer of any age can win the BARA provided they have shot the Open Distances at the relevant tournaments.

There will be a BARA Award for the following categories:

Recurve Men, Recurve Women, Compound Men, Compound Women, Barebow Men and Barebow Women.

Registration & Accreditation

Registration

Archers will be required to sign in at the registration desk each day when attending the field. The desk will be located near the amenities block.

Accreditation

All competitors, coaches, RGB managers and athlete agents should obtain their accreditation on arrival at the venue. Your accreditation will be available at the registration desk.







Coach Accreditation

Applications for Coaching Accreditation close on the 7th November. For those requiring access to the field of play you MUST complete your application which can be found here

There will be no requests for coaching accreditation granted after the above date.

Archer Agent Accreditation

Any agents who are accompanying archers onto the tournament field will need to be accredited to gain access. This would be for those Para archers who are competing. If you require an agent to score for you and/or assistant, you will need to inform the OC so that accreditation can be arranged. An agent cannot coach an archer.

Para Archers MUST arrange their own agents.

Equipment Inspection

Equipment inspections are as per the program. It would be appreciated that all those who attend the Official Practice have their equipment inspected on that day.

For those who can't make Official Practice there wil be equipment inspections prior to each morning and afternoon session.

The location of equipment inspections will be announced each day.







General Information

Parking

Parking will be in the area adjacent to fields 3 and 4 with access via Masterman St.

Disabled Parking will be available within the competition grounds for those competitors holding a valid permit. Please email the LOC for further information at ntc@archery.org.au

Toilets

We will have full use of the ammenities block located behind the field of play.

Each entrance will be clearly marked Female & Male

Spectators

Spectator areas will be designated on the main range.

NO spectators will be permitted on the field of play.

Only officials, accredited persons (including RGB Team Mangers, Coaches and Archer Agents) and archers whilst shooting will be permitted on the field of play.

Accreditations must be displayed at all times and are not to be shared.

Water

Water will be available via water dispensers near the waiting line. Archers are to provide their own containers.

Food and Beverages at the Venue

Coffee Cart

A coffee cart will be at the venue when gates open each day of competition.

AA-IANSEO-WIFI



To score with IANSEO Scorekeeper NG your phone will need to be using the on-field IANSEO wireless network.

The WIFI details have been changed since last year, so every scorer will need to setup the new wifi details on their phone.

Use your phone camera app to scan this QR code which will automatically set the wireless password.

Please ensure you have wifi setup as soon as possible after you arrive. If you have any problems come to the scoring tent for assistance.








Individual Matchplay Scoring

To streamline matchplay scoring and reduce the time between matches, this year we will be providing each archer with a personal scoresheet showing all of their potential matches as they progress through the elimination.

For each match, scores will be entered on each competitor's scoresheet as the match progresses. On completion of the match, archers will verify and sign each other's scoresheet.

The match winner will progress to their next match, whilst the eliminated archer will return the completed and signed scoresheet to the scoring tent.











Scoring your match














- 1. Winner proceeds to next target according to their scoresheet(with their scoresheet)
- 2. Eliminated archer returns THEIR scoresheet (ONLY) to scoring tent








Team Matchplay Scoring

For each match, scores will be entered on each team's scoresheet as the match progresses. On completion of the match, teams will verify and sign each other's scoresheet.

The winning team will progress to their next match, whilst the eliminated team will return the completed and signed scoresheet to the scoring tent.

Scoring is conducted as per the individual scoring steps described above.
