Objective

This document details the Results and Scoring process that is to be undertaken as part of the conducting of a Tournament or QRE registered with Archery Australia.

Policy

Scoring

All scoring undertaken during Archery Australia registered Tournaments or QRE's shall be double scoring and may be wither one scorecard (paper and one Personal Electronic device undertaken using iscored.today at each target or double scorecard (paper).

Only Archery Australia approved scorecards can be used for Archery Australia registered Tournaments or QRE's.

In all cases scorecard (paper) will be considered the Officials Results in the case of a dispute or loss of electronic data.

Results

The results for all Archery Australia registered Tournaments or QRE's must be entered into the official Archery Australia Results and Scoring System (Archers Diary).

All results must be entered "Arrow by Arrow" into the official Archery Australia Results and Scoring System.

Results must be entered live using iscored.today or double scorecards can be used but scores must be entered "Arrow by Arrow" into Archers Diary.

Procedure

Scoring

1. Only the official scorecards can be used and are available on the Archery Australia website.
2. All scoring undertaken during Archery Australia registered Tournaments or QRE's shall be double scoring and may be wither one scorecard (paper) and one Personal Electronic device undertaken using iscored.today at each target or double Scorecard (paper).
3. Following the competition each local organisers will provide a facility where each scorecards will be checked.

If using a Single Scorecard and Online Electronic Device –

- a. Each archer will return to the Result Desk their fully completed scorecard for checking.
- b. The scorecard will be checked to ensure all required areas have been completes (Name, Date, Club/RGB, Member Number, Class, Division, Gender, etc.) and the Total Score, 10's and X's will be checked to ensure they correspond to the Total Score, 10's and X's listed in Archers Diary.

Note – 10's and X's for Target, Clout and Australian Indoor, 6's and 5's for WA Field, 5's and X's for National Field, 10's and 9's for WA Indoor.

- c. If the scorecard matches the score in Archers Diary it will be identified as APPROVED, at this time the scorecard shall be considered official and a true record of the score.

- d. If the scorecard is found to be incomplete or the scorecard does not match the score in Archers Diary the scorecard will be rejected and returned to the archer who will be given the opportunity to complete or correct additions on the scorecard with the exception of Arrow Values which cannot be changed.
- e. Additions and totals may be changed but “Arrow Values” cannot be changed.
If there is a discrepancy in “Arrow Values”, the lowest score recorded on the scorecard will be taken as official.
- f. At this time any correction can be made by the Results Team in Archers Diary.

If using double scorecards

- a. Each archer will return to the Result Desk both with their scorecards fully completed.
- b. Both scorecards will be checked to ensure all required areas have been completed (Name, Date, Club/RGB, Member Number, Class, Division, Gender, etc.) and the Total Score, 10’s and C’s on both scorecards correspond.

Note – 10’s and X’s for Target, Clout and Australian Indoor, 6’s and 5’s for WA Field, 5’s and X’s for National Field, 10’s and 9’s for WA Indoor.

- c. If the scorecards match they will be identified as APPROVED, at this time the scorecard shall be considered official and a true record of the score.
- d. If the scorecards are found to be incomplete or the scorecards do not match the scorecard will be rejected and returned and the archer will be given the opportunity to complete or correct additions on the scorecards with the exception of Arrow Values which cannot be changed.
- e. Additions and totals may be changed but “Arrow Values” cannot be changed.
If there is a discrepancy in “Arrow Values”, the lowest score recorded will be taken as official.
- f. If both scorecards correspond scores are to be entered into Archers Diary “Arrow by Arrow”. Scores that are not entered “Arrow by Arrow” will be considered invalid.

What needs to be checked on the scorecard?

1. Check the competitors name, club, membership number, date, round, gender, class and division have been completed.
2. All boxes requirements are completed and the Total Score, 10’s and X’s match the results in Archer Diary.
3. The scorecard is signed by the competitor and a witness.

Note – The adding up and accuracy of each score is not the responsibility of the Organising Committee.

Checking of scorecards for accuracy or the adding up of scores must not hold up processing of results

Results

1. The results for all Archery Australia registered Tournaments and QRE’s will be listed in Archery Diary.
2. Scored may be entered “Arrow by Arrow” online using a Personal Electronic Device and iscored.today in conjunction with a scorecard or manually into Archers Diary using imanged.today.
3. The Personal Electronic Device must have iscored.today installed.

4. Once all scores have been entered into Archers Diary either electronically or manually the Organising Committee or Results Team shall make a public announcement to that effect.

Following a period of 10 minute where scores can be viewed online if there is no complaint or appeals presentations can take place.

Results Management

1. Archers Diary iscored.today will be used for all registered tournaments and QRE's.
2. The Organising Committee must establish a Results Management Team to manage data entry and results prior to and during the event.

The Organising Committee may choose one of two options for the Results Management Team.

3. The Results Management Team will be responsible for:
 - a. Setting up the tournament in Archers Diary
 - b. Inputting competitors into Archers Diary
 - c. Being in attendance at Registration to manage registration changes
 - d. Conduct a scoring briefing with scorers prior to the start of the event
 - e. Manage Archers Diary and the input of scores during the championships
 - f. Manage the Results Desk
 - g. At the completion of each event verify each scorecard against Archers Diary
 - h. Make changes and updates to the results as required
4. Prior to the start of Official Practice or during Muster (field event) a representative from the Results Management Team will address competitors on the use of Archers Diary iscored.today.

During this meeting the following information will be passed on:

- a. Procedures and processes to be followed for the day
- b. Issue event password
- c. Process for requesting help during the event
- d. Answer questions

Results Management Procedure

1. At the end of shooting for the tournament each competitor shall bring their fully completed scorecard to the Results Desk.
2. A member of the Results Management Team will check each scorecard to ensure that;
 - a. The scorecard has been correctly and fully completed, this will include:
 - i. Archers name
 - ii. Member number
 - iii. Date
 - iv. RGB/Club
 - v. Round
 - vi. Total score
 - vii. 10's and X's (10's and 9's Clout, 6's and 5's for Field)
3. Then check the scorecard against results listed in Archers Diary, items to be checked will be:
 - a. Name
 - b. Total Score
 - c. 10's and X's (10's and 9's Clout, 6's and 5's for Field)

4. If the scorecard matches with Archers Diary the Results Management Team member will accept the scorecard and sign the scorecard to indicate it has been accepted by a member.
5. Should a discrepancy be found in the Total Score or 10's and X's (10's and 9's Clout, 6's and 5's for Field) against the Total Score or 10's and X's (10's and 9's Clout, 6's and 5's for Field) listed in Archers Diary the scorecard will be returned to the archer who will be given the opportunity to check and correct the scorecard.

At no stage can "Arrow Values" be changed.

6. The Results Management Team or the Organising Committee are not required to verify the accuracy of the additions on any submitted scorecard, however if the organiser or the officials note an error at the time of submission, they will ask the athletes concerned to correct such error and the result as correct will stand.
7. If after checking the scorecard and the score on the scorecard is lower or higher than that listed in Archers Diary the Results Management Team has the authority to amend Archers Diary to match the scorecard.

The scorecard is the official record of the score until it is confirmed that the scorecard and Archers Diary match. At this time the results in Archers Diary will become official.

8. When all scorecards have been checked and confirmed with Archers Diary the Results Management Team will make official an announcement to that effect.

Following a period of 10 minutes to allow for the final scored to be viewed in Archers Diary (and lodgement of any protests with the Jury of Appeal) the presentation of awards will take place.

If there is a protest lodged no presentation will take place until the Jury of Appeal has resolved the protest.
